OUR WORDS MATTER

Core Principle

- 1. Use person-first language
- 2. Avoid stereotypes and generalizations
- 3. Assign blame to the system, not the individual
- 4. Eliminate pejorative terms
- 5. Think critically and be intentional about using social identifiers
- State the facts avoid interpretations
- 7. Use inclusive language
- 8. Use the active voice
- 9. Don't weaponize quotes

Example

a person with diabetes, not a "diabetic"

"non-compliant," "poor historian"

"pt chooses" rather than "refuses"

convict, prostitute, alien

race, SES and language don't belong in the oneliner

"patient alleges/claims 10/10 pain"

"pt uses a wheelchair" rather than "wheelchair bound"

"I prescribed antibiotics"

patient is having "horrible" pain

When in doubt, ask yourself:

If I were the patient reading/hearing this, how would I feel?
