BRONCHOSCOPIC LUNG VOLUME REDUCTION (BLVR): YOUR MOST FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

To help our patients feel comfortable and informed about the BLVR procedure, below is a collection of frequently asked questions.

What type of valves are available?

There are two FDA-approved endobronchial valves on the market for BLVR. The Zephyr® Endobronchial Valve and the Spiration® Valve System. Both valves have been proven effective for patients with severe emphysema. The type of valve chosen is decided on by your medical team.

The Zephyr® Endobronchial Valve functions as a one-way valve that closes on inhalation to avoid air entering the diseased portion of the lung, then opens on exhalation to release trapped air.

The Spiration® Valve System is an umbrella-shaped, one-way valve that prevents airflow into the target lobe of the lung. Trapped air and secretions escape naturally along the airway wall.

Is it an inpatient or outpatient procedure?

BLVR is an inpatient procedure that takes place at Temple University Hospital – Main Campus.

Will I be under anesthesia?

Yes, general anesthesia is used for patients who undergo BLVR.

How long is the procedure?

Typically, the BLVR procedure lasts around 60 minutes, but could be longer.

How long will I be in the hospital?

Patients who receive BLVR stay at Temple University Hospital – Main Campus for a minimum of 4 nights for observation and X-rays to rule out any complications.

How long until I can be scheduled for the procedure after seeing the physician?

The typical wait time is about 4-6 weeks. This provides patients with time to undergo the necessary testing required prior to the procedure.

What tests are needed?

The following tests are required to determine if you might be a good candidate for treatment:

- · Pulmonary function testing
- · Cardiopulmonary exercise test
- · Arterial blood gas
- 6-minute walk test
- High-resolution computed tomography (chest)
- Echocardiography
- · Nuclear medicine cardiac stress test
- · Nuclear medicine perfusion scan

After these tests are complete, you will be scheduled to review with your Temple pulmonologist.



What complications can occur?

Every medical procedure has risks. Some of the complications that may occur with BLVR include:

Worsening of COPD Symptoms – In a very small number of patients, COPD symptoms may worsen after BLVR. This can include difficulty breathing or a fast heartbeat.

Respiratory failure – This is a serious problem that can occur when the exchange of oxygen and carbon dioxide in the lungs doesn't occur. This rare complication from BLVR can lead to difficulty breathing.

Pneumonia – Because it is minimally invasive, BLVR carries a much lower risk of infection than surgery. However, there is still a chance that you may get pneumonia.

Pneumothorax — This occurs when air builds up in the space between the chest wall and lungs. There is a chance this complication may occur following BLVR, and in most cases is treated by a temporary tube that lets air escape.

Who is a Candidate for BLVR using Endobronchial Valves? You could be considered for this procedure if you:

- Have chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD), specifically emphysema and severe hyperinflation
- Have not had major lung procedures such as lung transplant or LVRS
- Do not have major heart conditions such as uncontrolled atrial fibrillation or a recent heart attack
- · Have not smoked for at least 4 months

He was also the first in the country to implant both valves after FDA approval.

He works closely with patients who have undergone, or plan to undergo, BLVR to schedule follow-up appointments, answer questions, and make sure their needs are met.

Navigating The Lung Center




Temple Lung Center is located on the 5th Floor of Zone D (orange). (See next page for enlarged map)
