<u>HIV Clinic (40 weeks):</u> - Pharmacotherapy management of persons living with HIV, Hepatitis C, and other Infectious Diseases - Sexually Transmitted Infection treatment/prevention - Resident to attend clinic once weekly with exception of concomitant intensive care rotation	<u>Pharmacy Practice (spread between 46 weeks):</u> - Clinical staffing every 3rd weekend - Must staff two holidays
