TEMPLE UNIVERSITY HEALTH SYSTEM

Temple University Health System (TUHS) is a \$2.2 billion academic health system dedicated to providing access to quality patient care and supporting excellence in medical education and research. The Health System consists of Temple University Hospital (TUH); TUH-Episcopal Campus; TUH-Jeanes Campus; TUH-Northeastern Campus; The Hospital of Fox Chase Cancer Center and Affiliates, an NCI-designated comprehensive cancer center; Temple Transport Team, a ground and air-ambulance company; Temple Physicians, Inc., a network of community-based specialty and primary-care physician practices; and Temple Faculty Practice Plan, Inc., TUHS's physician practice plan comprised of more than 500 full-time and part-time academic physicians in 20 clinical departments. TUHS is affiliated with the Lewis Katz School of Medicine at Temple University (LKSOM).

LEWIS KATZ SCHOOL OF MEDICINE AT TEMPLE UNIVERSITY

Lewis Katz School of Medicine at Temple University, established in 1901, is one of the nation's leading medical schools. Each year, the School of Medicine educates approximately 800 medical students and 125 graduate students. Based on its level of funding from the National Institutes of Health, The Lewis Katz School of Medicine is the second highest ranked medical school in Philadelphia and the third highest in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. According to *U.S. News & World Report*, TUSM is among the top 10 most applied-to medical schools in the nation.
